EU plastic waste export 2021 (HS 3915)

- Plastic Waste Trade Exports to Non-OECD countries initially declined as new Basel Plastic Amendment restrictions began on January 1, 2021, but have been steadily increasing.
- E.U. is shifting plastic waste exports between Turkey and Non-OECD countries as Turkey's ban is relaxed:
 - Turkey: Increase in E.U. exports to Turkey from
 4.5 million kg/month in June 2021 to 10.6 million kg/month in August 2021.
 - Non-OECD Countries: Decrease in E.U. exports to Non-OECD countries from 45.1 million kg/month in June 2021 to 40.9 million kg/month in August 2021.

• <u>Netherlands:</u>

- Dramatically increased plastic waste exports to Non-OECD countries in 2021, from an average of 8.3 million kg/month in 2020 to 19.6 million kg/month in August 2021.
- High volume of plastic waste exports to Malaysia (3.8 million kg/month), Indonesia (7.1 million kg/month) and to Vietnam (5.5 million kg/month) in August 2021.

• <u>Germany:</u>

- Increased plastic waste exports to Malaysia from 2.6 million kg/month in January 2021 to 4.6 million kg/month in August 2021.
- Decreased plastic waste exports to Turkey from 7.9 million kg/month in May 2021 to 1.2 million kg/month in June 2021. This increased to 3.4 million kg/month in August 2021 as Turkey's ban was relaxed.

Recommendations

- 1. Comply and implement Basel new rules on plastic waste trade
- 2. Trade with certified companies (exporter as well as importers)
- 3. Take back the problematic shipments (Germany-Turkey case)
- 4. Increase recycling capacity in the EU countries or the Central Europe
- 5. Improve control of wastes trades, improve ports inspection, enforce law
- 6. Reduce single-use plastics, make redesign packaging mandatory
- 7. New plastic/petrochemical manufacturers included in negative investment list
- 8. Include plastic and petrochem in climate mitigation and adaptation toxic carbon
- 9. Eliminate the toxic impact of chemicals in every phase of plastics life cycle production, use and disposal.
